## Types of Questions

The exam will cover both reading and writing questions resembling the English portions of the SAT or ACT. There will be around 5 different passages with corresponding questions underneath. The questions will cover topics like reading comprehension, implications or inferences, passage organization, author's opinions, relations between text, meanings of figurative language, purpose, rhetorical devices, and style and effect.

## Tips

- Read the passage once but annotate meaningfully. Utilize words or symbols to help with understanding
- Expect dull reading
- Main goal is to comprehend what you are reading, annotate to help your understanding
- List key points/ideas
- Note shifts in arguments
- You could label specific rhetorical devices, but focus on comprehension not analyzing
- Note topics, subtopics, or italics if possible. Read the blurb underneath the heading of each topic to get background knowledge on the piece of writing.
- Circle and return to harder questions, answer the easier ones first
- Remember you do not have to read the passages in order
- Cross out the distracting answers
- Strive to answer each question, remember to pace, and remind yourself of how much time you have
